


The Titanic Fact Cards

The Titanic has 20 life boats with a capacity of 1178 people, only enough to hold half of the passengers. During the disaster some life boats were only filled half full.



The Titanic Fact Cards

The food items recorded when the ship set sail included 40,000 eggs, 15,000 pounds of fresh fish, around 40,000 sausages and 1,000 bottles of wine.




The Titanic Fact Cards

The Titanic was captained by Edward Smith, born in Hanley, Stoke-on-trent. It is rumoured that he planned to retire after the voyage.



The Titanic Fact Cards

There were around 900 crew members and only 215 survived. The ship's two bands came together to play in an attempt to keep up spirits as the ship sank. None of the band members survived.

Weight: 46, 328 tons


Length: 269 metres


The Titanic was the first ship to contain a heated swimming pool.



The Titanic Fact Cards


1517 people died in the disaster. Out of those only 306 bodies were recovered from the sea.

The largest proportion of survivors came from first class.




The Titanic Fact Cards
